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I. THE AERONAUTICAL SOCIETY OF INDIA

1. *Brief History :*

The Aeronautical Society of India was established in 1948 under the Societies Registration Act XXI of 1860 with the support and patronage of Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru, who also became the Society's first Patron-in-Chief. The Society was formally inaugurated by Pandit Nehru at the Puttanna Chetty Town Hall, Bangalore on the 27th of December 1948.

Over the years, the Society has grown into a major professional body with a large number of corporate members including all major organization industries in the field of aeronautics in the country and also some of the world's leading aeronautical industries. Individual members include eminent Scientists, Pilots; Engineers and Technologists drawn from all major organizations like the Hindustan Aeronautics Limited, DGCA, DRDO, India Air Force, Indian Airlines, National Aerospace Laboratories, Aeronautical Developments Agency, Aeronautics Research and Development Board, Airports Authority of India, Gas Turbine Research Establishment, Aeronautical Development Establishment, Pawan Hans Helicopters Limited, Indian Space Research Organization, etc.

2. *Organization and Management :*

The affairs of the society are managed by a Council consisting of President, President-Elect, Seven Vice-Presidents, Honorary Secretary General, Honorary Treasurer, Twelve members elected by the General Body and three members nominated by the President to represent special interests. Two immediate Past Presidents of the Society, the Chairman of all branches of the Society and the Editor-Journal of the Society are ex-officio members of the council. The Council is elected by the members every year at the Annual General Meeting of the Society.

3. *Objectives:*

The objectives of the Society are to promote the advancement and diffusion of the knowledge of the aeronautical sciences and aircraft engineering and the elevation of aeronautical profession.

4. *Activities :*

- i) The society provides a platform to professionals in the field of aeronautics to meet and discuss issues of mutual interest.
- ii) The Society organizes Seminars, Workshops and Conferences to promote aeronautics and bring about greater awareness in this field.
- iii) The Society publishes a quarterly journal devoted to research and technical papers on various facets of aeronautical sciences.

- iv) The Society confers a number of awards for outstanding contributions in fundamental/applied research in the field of aeronautics and space every year.
- v) The Society conducts annual essay competitions to recognize and encourage talent amongst young scientists, engineers and students.
- vi) The Society conducts examination in aeronautical engineering twice every year. About 100 candidates graduate every semester.
- vii) The Society provides library facilities at Delhi for Delhi based student-members. A good number of Branches of the Society have also established library facilities for local students. Student-members are advised to ascertain further details from the respective Branch offices.
- viii) The Society also provides multimedia and video based learning facilities at its Headquarters.
- ix) The Society has instituted a number of prizes to encourage students.
- x) The Society organizes On Job Training for those who have successfully completed Section-A and Section-B examinations. Of these, merit students are also provided financial stipend of Rs3000.00 pm for period up to one year.
- xi) The Society encourages young scientists to participate in international conferences for presenting technical papers, by way of part financial support.

II. ASSOCIATE MEMBERSHIP EXAMINATION :

5. *Recognition of the Examination :*

The Society conducts Associate Membership Examination twice a year. A pass in Section-A and Section- B of this examination has been recognized by the Ministry of Education, at par with a Bachelor's Degree in Aeronautical Engineering from an India University. The subject letter is reproduced below:

Candidates are eligible to appear in GATE for Post-Graduates studies at some of the IITs after successfully completing Section-A and Section-B. Some of other Universities and educational institutions have also recognized this examination for higher studies, and students are advised to confirm such details from the respective institutions directly.

The Engineering Council, London has recognized our examination and those who have completed Section A & B of the Society examination shall be granted direct entry into Part 2 of their examination.

6. Details of Examination :

The examination, named "Associate Membership Examination" is being conducted since year 1953. The syllabus for this examination was revised, updated and approved by Govt of India vide its letter No.F.18-21/74-T-2 dated 21st July 1975 and has been in force since then.

The syllabus has now once again been updated and its approval obtained from Govt of India vide letter, copy reproduced below, after having been evaluated and recommended by All India Council of Technical Education.

The Governing Council of Aeronautical Society of India had authorised conduct of the Associate Membership Examination with new updated syllabus from June 2006 exam session. As per rules, all student members registered on or after 01 August, 05 would be evaluated as per the new updated syllabus. Student members enrolled / registered prior to 01 August 05 were free to pursue studies and continue appearing in the examination with un – modified syllabus , however, they were advised to change over to the modified syllabus at the earliest since the examinations with unmodified syllabus would be conducted for a few sessions only..

The Associate Membership Examination of Section 'A' with un-modified syllabus was conducted upto Dec 07 session only and closed thereafter.

The Section B examination with un- modified syllabus was conducted upto Dec, 10 Examination session and discontinued there after.

Like the current unmodified syllabus, the modified syllabus also has two parts, called, Section-A and Section-B. Brief details of the two Sections are placed below. (For full details please refer to the Syllabus)

Section-A

There are ten compulsory subjects in this Section and also there is a practical capsule of six weeks duration on workshop practices. The compulsory ten subjects are:

Eligibility for appearing in the Section-A

A candidate who has passed Intermediate or 10+2 or Higher Secondary Examination (12 years course) with Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics and 50% or more marks in each : or who had passed the Studentship Examination of the Society up to June 98 session after which examination was stopped, can appear in Section A . Candidates who have passed B. Sc. (Physics, Chemistry & Maths) with a minimum aggregate of 50% in each of the three subjects over the three year period or Diploma in Engineering (3 years course) with 50% marks in aggregate over the three year period or Aircraft Maintenance Engineering Course of 3 years duration from Institutes recognized by DGCA and passed in 3 subject paper of DGCA Examination viz 1. Aircraft Regulations 2. Aircraft General Engineering and 3. Aircraft systems are also eligible to appear in Section A. Airmen of Indian Air Force in any of the following trades under X category are also eligible to appear in Section A.

AF/Fit. Elect/Fit. Eng/Fit. Inst/Fit. Rad/Fit. Rdo/Fit. Wpn/Fit. MT/Fit. Wks/Fit. (M) Photo/Fit. Missile/Fit(M), Missile/Fit.(L),Missile/Fit(E)

The following - categories of Air Technical personnel of the Indian Navy are also eligible to appear in Section A. Aircraft Artificer. Electrical Artificer (Air), Electrical Artificer (Air Radio), Aircraft Artificer (Weapons), all 5th Class and Leading Air Mechanics, Leading Electrical Mechanics (Air Radio), Leading Electrical Mechanics (Air) and Leading Air Ordnance Mechanics.

Candidates who possess a degree in Engineering or have passed Section A & B examination of any other professional institution which has been recognized by the Government as being equivalent to a degree in engineering, can also register for the examination. Such Engg graduates shall be eligible to seek exemption from appearing in up to six subjects of Section-A, details as follows:-

- (a) Engg graduates belonging to Electrical / IT disciplines can get exemption of six subjects, namely Applied Maths-I, Basic Electronics, Electrical Engineering, Microprocessors & Software Engineering, Engineering Drawing & Design, and, Workshop Technology.
- (b) Engg students belonging to Mechanical/civil/chemical etc disciplines can get exemption of six subjects, namely Applied Maths-I, Fluid Mechanics, Strength of Material, Engineering Thermodynamics, Engineering Drawing & Design, and, Workshop Technology.
- (c) Graduate degree holders in Engineering, Diploma holders in Engineering and those with AME Course (3 years duration) are exempted from 6 week workshop Training Capsule.

Section-B

The Section-B has four different streams to choose from, and each stream has nine compulsory subjects and one elective subject, making a total of ten subjects. The four streams are titled Aero-mechanical; Avionics; Maintenance & Production(Electrical); and, Maintenance & Production (Mechanical) streams. A candidate can select either of the four streams at one time while pursuing Section-B. Each stream has ten theoretical subjects and two practical training capsules each of six weeks duration.

Eligibility for appearing in the Section-B

Candidates who have successfully completed Section-A subjects and the six week training capsule on workshop practices are eligible to appear in the Section-B.

7. Registration :

- a) Candidates who wish to appear in the Associate Membership Examination conducted by the society should register themselves as Student Members of the Society. Application form for registration should be sent on the prescribed form, which is attached with the Prospectus. The Prospectus costs Rs. 10/-. For receiving it by regd post/courier, please remit Rs.50.00 by bank DD.
- b) Candidates, who qualify for Registration/Exemption as per conditions in para 6 should submit the duly completed application along with the following:-
 - (i) Pass Certificate of Class-X, in original as well as a Certified True Copy for verification of Date of Birth and spelling/format of individuals name and father's name.
 - (ii) Marksheet(s) and passing certificate of Class-XII/Diploma/BSc, as applicable, in original as well as a Certified True Copy for ascertaining the defined qualification for registration.
 - (iii) A bank DD of Rs 5000/- for the applicable fee plus postage charges for sending Registration Card, I-Card, Rules & Regulations Book and allied documents with Syllabus.
- c) Certified True Copies of certificates must be signed by the student as well as attested by a Gazetted Officer/ Head of a Recognized Educational institution or a Member (full) of the Society. The name and designation of attestor should be clearly visible and he should affix his seal/rubber stamp on the document.
- d) All financial payments to the Society are to be through Demand Draft/ Banker's Cheque/Payorder drawn in favour of the Aeronautical Society of India and payable at New Delhi.
- e) Registration process may take about 3 to 4 weeks.

- f) Candidates, whose applications for registration are received between 01 February to 31 July, shall be eligible to appear in the exams from following December exam-session onwards. Candidates, whose applications for registration are received between 01 August to 31 January, shall be eligible to appear in the exams from the following June session onwards. With additional payment of late fee of Rs1000/-, the last date for each block is extended by one month, i.e. up to 28th February and 31st August respectively.
- g) Registration Number shall be allotted to every candidate who has been accepted as a Student Member. Depending upon his/her educational qualifications, he/she shall be permitted to appear in Section A.
- h) The society reserves the right to reject an application for Registration without assigning any reason.

8 . Examination Centers :

The Examination is held twice a year in June/December at the following thirteen centres, namely: BANGALORE, CHENNAI, DELHI, GUWAHATI, HYDERABAD, INDORE, KANPUR, KHARAGPUR, KOCHI. MUMBAI, NAGPUR, PUNE and THIRUVANANTHAPURAM.

A candidate may select the centre of his choice. Change of examination centre can be permitted provided a request for the same is received with payable fee, of Rs 200/- two weeks before the start of the examination.

9. Examination Application Form:

Application Form for the examination can be had on request, free of charge, by candidates already registered with the Society by sending a self-addressed (9"X4") envelope stamped for Rs. 10/- quoting their registration number. A candidate should submit a fresh application form, for every session.

The completed exam application form should be sent not earlier than 15th February for June and 15th August for December session examinations. The last date of receipt of Examination Application Forms, without late fee is 10th April/10th October and with late fee of Rs 500/- is 25th April /25th October for June and December session examination, respectively.

10. General Information about the Examination :

i) Time Limit

(a) Time Limit for Completion of Section 'A'

A time limit of four years is specified for all student members registered on or after 1st Feb., 2008 [bearing Registration Number S-08-1001 onwards and eligible for appearing first time from Dec. 2008 exam session

onwards]. After four years of registration or eight exam sessions, a student will be entitled to get extension of one consecutive exam session, provided he is left with up to three subjects. After the extension, if the student fails to complete the Section 'A', his/ her registration will stand cancelled.

All students members with Registration Numbers prior to S-08-1001 will be permitted to complete Section A within the validity of their registration period of 8 years or latest by June, 2012 examination session whichever is earlier.

(b) Time Limit for Completion of Section 'B'

A time limit of four years is specified for all student members entering Section 'B'. After completion of 4 years / 8 continuous exam sessions, extension of one consecutive exam session will be given to only those short of up to 3 subjects to complete section 'B'.

(c) Re - Registration

For Re-registration in either section 'A' or in section 'B', credits for subjects already cleared will not be carried forward to new registration.

- ii) A candidate will have to apply for at least four exam sessions during Section-A and at least four exam sessions in Section-B. In each such session, a candidate is allowed to take a minimum of one and maximum of four subjects of his choice of Section-A or Section-B as applicable.
- iii) The marks allotted to each subject are 100. The pass marks in each subject are 50. A candidate who secures a pass in any subject is not expected to re-appear in that subject. However, a candidate is permitted to re-appear only once in any subject to improve his performance and for this prior permission from the HO is essential. Violation of this aspect may lead to disciplinary action against the student concerned. Higher of the two scores will be accounted in the final mark sheet.
- iv) Result is normally declared in the 2nd/3rd week of following August/February for the examinations conducted in June/December, respectively. The results are placed on website www.aerosocietyindia.in
- v) No certificate or mark sheet will be issued on completion of Section-A.
- vi) Consolidated Mark Sheet & Provisional Certificate can be obtained immediately after successfully completing Section-B. Such successful candidates must submit request along with bank DD in respect of arrears of dues, if any, and four stamp size photographs. Completion certificate will be handed over to candidates during Business Session of the Society's AGM, usually held in Dec/Jan every year.
- vii) A candidate may apply for recounting of marks of the immediate past session on payment of Rs. 500/- per subject to ascertain whether all

answers have been marked and the marks awarded have been added correctly. Revaluation of answer books shall be undertaken only if all attempted questions in the answer book have not been evaluated by the examiner. This option is available only till the conduct of the next session examination.

- viii) Detailed instructions are available in the book titled Rules & Regulations of the Examination, a copy handed over at the time of registration to every candidate.
- ix) For any additional information. Candidates should send a 9" X 4" self addressed and stamped envelope (for Rs. 5/-) for prompt reply. For reply to be sent by registered post, the envelope may be stamped appropriately.
- x) There is a maximum time limit of 4 years for completing Section A & 4 years for completing Section B from the date of registration.
- xi) Candidates may appear in any additional stream after completing Section - B in one of the streams only after obtaining prior permission.

11. Private Coaching Institutions / Colleges : Recognition of :

The Society is aware that some private institutions/colleges and few other professional bodies are conducting coaching classes for candidates taking the Associate Membership Examination of the Society. The Society has a policy not to accord affiliation or recognition to any such coaching institution/college. Candidates are expected to take necessary precautions against likely disputes with such institutions.

12. Library facilities :

The Society has Library facilities at Delhi and at some of its branches which cater to needs of only local students & members.

13. Identity Card :

An Identity Card will be issued initially with a validity of five years at the time of registration. For renewal of I. Card the students should send a DD of Rs 100/-, two recent stamp size photographs and a self addressed envelope stamped for Rs. 25/- towards sending Identity Card by Speed/Registered Post.

d) Composite fee for life membership: Rs.1500.00 (payable in two installments of Rs.750.00 each, first, on completion of Sec. A and, second, on completion of Sec. B).

e) Special fee for use of library at AeSI HeadOffice NewDelhi and at Branches (By all student members)

- i) Library security (refundable) : Rs.3000.00 (per card) (max no. of cards to be issued : Two)

15. Unsolved Question Papers :

Question papers of previous sessions in each subject are available on payment of a token fee of Rs.100/- per set of question papers for Section 'A' and Section 'B' excluding Postage. The candidates should submit self addressed envelope (suitably stamped) and Demand Draft of appropriate amount while making a request.

16. Mode of Payment :

All payments to the society should be made only by a crossed Demand Draft/ Banker's Cheque. All payments should be in favour of "The Aeronautical Society of India" payable at New Delhi. Payment by Money Order, M.T., Cheque, Postal Order or cash is not acceptable.

17. Completion Certificate :

Provisional completion Certificate along with Consolidated marksheet shall be issued to a candidate who has completed Section A & B examination. The candidate should send an application form for issue of Completion Certificate giving full particulars together with requisite fee, four stamp size photographs and the outstanding composite fee. The Completion certificate shall be issued during the ensuing Annual General Meeting held in January every year. However, consolidated Marksheet and Provisional Certificate shall be issued within one month after receipt of request as mentioned above.

II. ALLIED GENERAL INFORMATION :***18. Graduate Membership :***

Candidates who have completed section A & B and have paid the first and second instalments of Life Composite Fee shall be automatically elected as Graduate Members of the Society. For this, after issue of Consolidated Marksheet and Provisional Certificate, Graduate Membership will be approved by the Governing council of the Society. The candidates will be forwarded necessary papers for their signatures and return of those papers for issue of Graduate Life Membership Cards.

19. Prizes and Awards for the Students :

- i) Shri R. Venkataraman Prize is awarded for the best overall performance in the Associate Membership Examination during the year. The Prize amount is Rs. 3000/-.
- ii) Society's Prize is awarded for the second best overall performance among students in this Examination during the year. The prize amount is Rs. 2500/-.
- iii) Indian Air Force welfare Prize of Rs. 1500/- is awarded for the best performance by an Indian Air Force personnel (including retired) during the year in this examination.
- iv) Dr. Abdul Kalam Prize is Rs. 3000/-. It is shared by students who score highest marks in any subject of Section B in June & December session, each year.

- v) Mrs. Kiran Kant Prize is awarded for best performance by a female candidate during the year in the examination. The prize amount is Rs. 2500/-.

20. Scope / Placement :

- i) Candidates who have successfully completed Section A & B of the Associate Membership examination of the Society are treated at par with those holding a Degree in Aeronautical Engineering from an Indian University for recruitment to superior posts and services under the Central Government.
- ii) The Society's graduates are eligible to compete in the Graduate Aptitude Test in Engineering (GATE) for admission to IITs etc. for higher studies.
- iii) Some of the Universities in India and abroad admit our students for higher studies.
- iv) Those who have successfully completed Section A & B examination of the Society are occupying responsible posts in Hindustan Aeronautics Limited, Indian Airlines, Air India, Pawan Hans Helicopters Limited, Defence Research & Development Organisation, National Aeronautical Laboratories, Aeronautical Development Agency, Civil Aviation Department, various DRDO Laboratories and private airlines.

21. Stipend Scheme :

The Scheme is to provide on-job-experience/training in aeronautical industry, Airlines and R&D establishments and thereby to help the student members to secure a suitable job. The scheme is open for those who have completed Section B with minimum aggregate of 60% marks in Section B subjects. Selection is purely on merit. The duration of the on-job-experience/training is one year and selected candidates are given a stipend of Rs. 3000/- per month by the Society. The total number of vacancies approved by the Council is limited to 20 only.
